Requirements:

- idea for a PhD project in English literary studies
- excellent language skills in English and very good language skills in German
- willingness to engage actively in research projects within the department
- readiness to assist in administrative duties
- superior communication skills as well as proven organisational skills
- interest in the area of cognitive literary studies is desirable

Please also submit a PDF document of your MA thesis (or equivalent). If you have not yet completed your MA thesis (or equivalent), please submit completed chapters, as well as a letter of recommendation from your supervisor, which includes the expected date of completion of your MA degree.
